Wild Blue is a 2007 C-Dory Cruiser; one of the most capable, efficient vessels in its size range.

C-Dorys are used from Alaska to Florida, off-shore and inland waters. The cabin provides protection with a great view all around. Here are answers to frequently asked questions...

Life Jackets: personal flotation devices are located on the bulkhead by the windshield and in a case in the cockpit, cleverly labeled "Life Jackets." You are welcome to wear one anytime aboard, but it is not required.

Can we move around while underway? Sure. Wild Blue is stable, thanks to the dory hull form. There is seating in the cabin, built in seats in the cockpit, and comfortable portable chairs for use in the cockpit. The view is great from all the seats.

Is there a bathroom? Yep; in a little room, just like on an airline. It works just about like your potty at home, but the flush handle is a "step on". Nothing but what goes through you and TP goes in the head... no paper towels, no feminine "products", no paper cups, and if you drop your wallet in there, you're on your own.

What if I get seasick? Not likely with the ride of the C-Dory, but let us know if you don't feel well. Keep an eye on the horizon, step outside and get some fresh air. If it persists, we'll show you where the swimstep is at the back of the cockpit and you can "go for distance".

Is the boat safe? Absolutely. The boat is incredibly well constructed and equipped with all US Coast Guard required equipment. State of the art navigation gear (sure, we'll show you), radar, satellite imagery, VHF communications, depth sounder, and a very reliable Honda motor.
